MARKETPLACE SESSIONS

The marketplace is a space provided for representative from the member projects and working groups present their innovations, initiatives, and knowledge products from their work in their projects and/or in the sector networks. This will be called an "Innovation Stand."

The objective of the session is to provide the space for the member projects and working groups to present their innovations and initiatives within a short time space. This would present an opportunity for colleagues to have an overview of some project and working group activities as well as learn about some innovations and best practices within SNRD Africa. The goal is to initiate important discussions and exchanges between colleagues. Please note that the Marketplace would be an **in-presence session only**.

One or two representatives would stand beside the pinboard and be ready to give a short presentation. Participants can choose to visit and engage with at most three Innovation stands of their choice. After the entire session is over, the pinboards will then be placed around the event area for participants to freely visit during their breaks

FIELD VISITS

This year, our Fieldtrips will take place on **Thursday**, **12 October 2023**. The field trips will highlight project impacts, demonstrate success stories and introduce partners and beneficiaries on the ground. Participants will have the opportunity to meet relevant stakeholders, engage in discussions and learn from other projects' experiences:

Learn about women's access to land and agroecology from the women's group in the village of Latmingué. This field trip permits visiting a group, called "Bokk Yaakar", which has recently secured 2 hectares of land and has for the first-time piloted cultivating beans (niébé, vigna unguiculata) and groundnuts (arachide, arachis hypogaea) with organic fertilizer. The Seen Suuf project provides selected groups with trainings, equipment and inputs for their chosen activities.

 Exchange with the "Réseau des femmes en agriculture biologique et commerce équitable (Réfabec) » (A Network of women in organic farming and fair trade) which is part of the Network of actors involved in agroecology in Senegal (Dytaes - Dynamique pour une Transition Agroécologique au Sénégal).

Visit to the "Reine du sel" (Queen of Salt). In Senegal, Marie Diouf is one of the few women to own her own salt farm. Nicknamed "the Queen of salt", she adds iodine to her crystals to combat deficiencies. An essential balance for good health.

Explore a Farm supported by E-Tolbi. E-Tolbi is a real-time digital decision-making platform that includes mobile agriculture and digital profiling of farmers for proper campaign management, irrigation water and fertilization control, and remote farming practices. e-Tolbi provides farming organizations with real-time agricultural yield statistics on fields and production sites.

Visit the SIDIO Group of the Cluster Diourbel. SIDIO brings together a dozen companies offering high-quality products and services in five major sectors: trading, agricultural production, food processing and consulting. SIDIO works on projects that take social and environmental development into account.

 Visit to a community where baobabs are grown and baobab-based products are used for local marketing. Explore the Baobab de Saveurs factory in Thiès which engages in simulated processing of Baobab powder and oil, as well as other natural products.

BEFORE TRAVELLING TO SENEGAL

Entry Requirements

- To enter Senegal, you must have a legally valid passport that does not expire for at least 6 months and has at least 1 blank page.
- Evidence of yellow-fever and COVID-19 vaccinations are required for entry into Senegal. A meningitis vaccination is highly recommended if the traveler is arriving from or has recently traveled to an endemic area.

What to Bring?

CLOTHING

The weather in Somone in October is very warm with average highs of 34.7°C (94.46°F) and lows of 23.0°C (73.4°F).

We would recommend you bring adequate summer attire with a few items fit for rain, such as a raincoat or an umbrella, when you go out of the hotel. Rainfall in October in Somone is moderate with an average of 11 rainy days.

For our field visits on Thursday, casual summer attire that allows a lot of movements is recommended. Sneakers, T-shirts with jeans or trousers as well as hats to protect you from the sun would be ideal.

Don't forget to bring along your sunscreen, as well as insect repellant creams or mosquito spray, as there may be the presence of mosquitoes and bugs in some common areas

DIGITAL DEVICES

In Senegal the power plug sockets are of type C, D, E and K. The standard voltage is 230 V and the frequency is 50 Hz.

The predominant type used is the **Type C**: also known as the standard "Euro" plug. This socket also works with plug E and plug F.

You may consider bringing along an International travel adapter to facilitate charging/using your electronic devices.

COMMUNITY GUIDELINES

The conference aims to serve as an inclusive, environmentally friendly, and forward-thinking framework where participants can exchange ideas and cross-country learning is encouraged. We are committed to enable a conference at which everyone can participate in an inclusive, respectful, and safe environment. By attending the conference, participants agree to:

- Communicate in an open and respectful way that values the diversity of opinions and perspectives
- Abstain from humiliating, discriminatory, and harassing conduct and language towards other participants, as well as towards all staff (hotel staff, services providers, and external support) involved in the conference.
- Discrimination in any form because of race, gender, sexual orientation, physical ability or appearance, ethnicity, national origin, political affiliation, age, religion, or any other reason is not tolerated. In accordance with the General Act on Equal Treatment (AGG, German Law), we have a duty to take necessary – and preventive – measures to ensure protection against discrimination on these grounds.
- Given that Germany has a particular historical responsibility towards the global community, we consider any form of antisemitic statement or behaviour to be a particularly severe case of discrimination.
- Any form of verbal, nonverbal or physical sexual harassment is not tolerated.
- Sexual harassment is a criminal offence. Sexual harassment occurs when 'unwanted conduct of a sexual nature takes place with the purpose or effect of violating the dignity of the person concerned, in particular where it creates an intimidating, hostile, degrading, humiliating or offensive environment'. This conduct also includes 'unwanted sexual acts and requests to carry out sexual acts, physical contact of a sexual nature, comments of a sexual nature, as well as the unwanted showing or public exhibition of pornographic images'
- We do not tolerate any form of sexual exploitation of other people by members of our workforce.
- Sexual exploitation occurs where conduct of a sexual nature takes place on a consensual basis but deliberately exploits an emergency situation or a position of power. Sexual contact with children under the age of 18 is automatically regarded as sexual harassment.
- Exchange of money, employment, goods or services for sex, including sexual favours or other forms of humiliating, degrading or exploitative behaviour, is not tolerated.

Who can I talk to during the event?

• We will designate specific areas within the conference venue as safer spaces, prominently marked and easily identifiable. We will establish clear reporting mechanisms for attendees to report incidents of harassment or discrimination, including anonymous channels, to ensure individuals feel comfortable coming forward.
